popular at the sale. Tomatoes, beans, squashes, pumpkins, peppers and other edibles go like 'hotcakes'. Fruit trees, berry bushes are also another "hot" item.

<u>Do not bring any invasive or aggressive plants</u> to be sold at the sale. Those plants include **ivies, periwinkle, bachelor's buttons, mountain bluet, butterfly bush, english holly, scotch broom, St John's wort, lamium, yellow flag iris.** These plants can easily escape a garden and choke out native plants in the wild.

Plants like **alyssum** are so popular at our sale. They are great ground covers, hiding places for spiders and other beneficial insects and for attracting pollinators to veggie gardens! They are so easy to grow from seed also.

Our plant sale will be held in the parking lot of IKEA Richmond on May 7, 9:30am to 12:30pm, the day before Mother's Day. The community will be so happy we are back with this very popular sale.

More information will be available about bringing the plants to the sale on event day. We will also be asking for volunteers on that day to help out. Stay tuned!

## Plants to divide right now

We are very busy in Paulik Park dividing plants to create more plants for our garden beds. Here is a list of what you should be dividing and potting up right now:

- \*beautiful ferns
- \*irises
- +pulmonaria
- \*forget-me-nots
- \*snowdrops, daffodils (once blooms die back)
- \*grasses
- \*hostas (once fully leaved out)
- \*brunnera
- \*astilbe
- +rudbeckia



For those new members who have not visited Paulik Park, we invite you to come over and visit us while we work in the 30+ perennial garden beds. These beds were created by Mrs Paulik in the 1930s when the Paulik family farmed the land. Mr. Paulik planted all the magnificent trees brought in from the North Shore and other locations.

# City of Richmond, 2022 Parks, Recreation and Community Events Grant

Richmond Garden Club applied for two grants this year. We recently heard back from the City of Richmond that we were awarded a grant of \$2,000.

Our grant proposal to the City outlined three key projects we are involved in that contribute to beautifying Richmond and to environmental and sustainable goals.

We plan on holding an open house in June this year to showcase our key projects – Paulik Park, rooftop garden at Richmond Cultural Centre and the dozen seasonal containers on the Steveston boardwalk for Steveston Harbour Authority.

We will be showcasing the work we are doing to beautify the City, attract pollinators, introduce native plants, raise fruit trees, shrubs, vegetables and herbs in small spaces.

Our plan includes having a garden expert at each location to answer gardening questions from the community.

Our next step will be to choose a date (or dates) to host our event. A report is expected back to the City on how the funds were spent.
